

SHORELINE RESTORATION — Americorps Vista Volunteers have been working with Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed to rebuild washed-out sections of the shoreline at Norcross Point park in Winthrop. The work came at no cost to the town of Winthrop, according to Winthrop Town Manager Cornell Knight, and shortly after several townspeople had expressed concern about the decay of the town-owned shoreline. Bob Moore, executive director of Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed, said that eight Americorps volunteers will work for eight weeks in the Cobbossee Lakes region on erosion control and as boat inspectors for invasive plants.
